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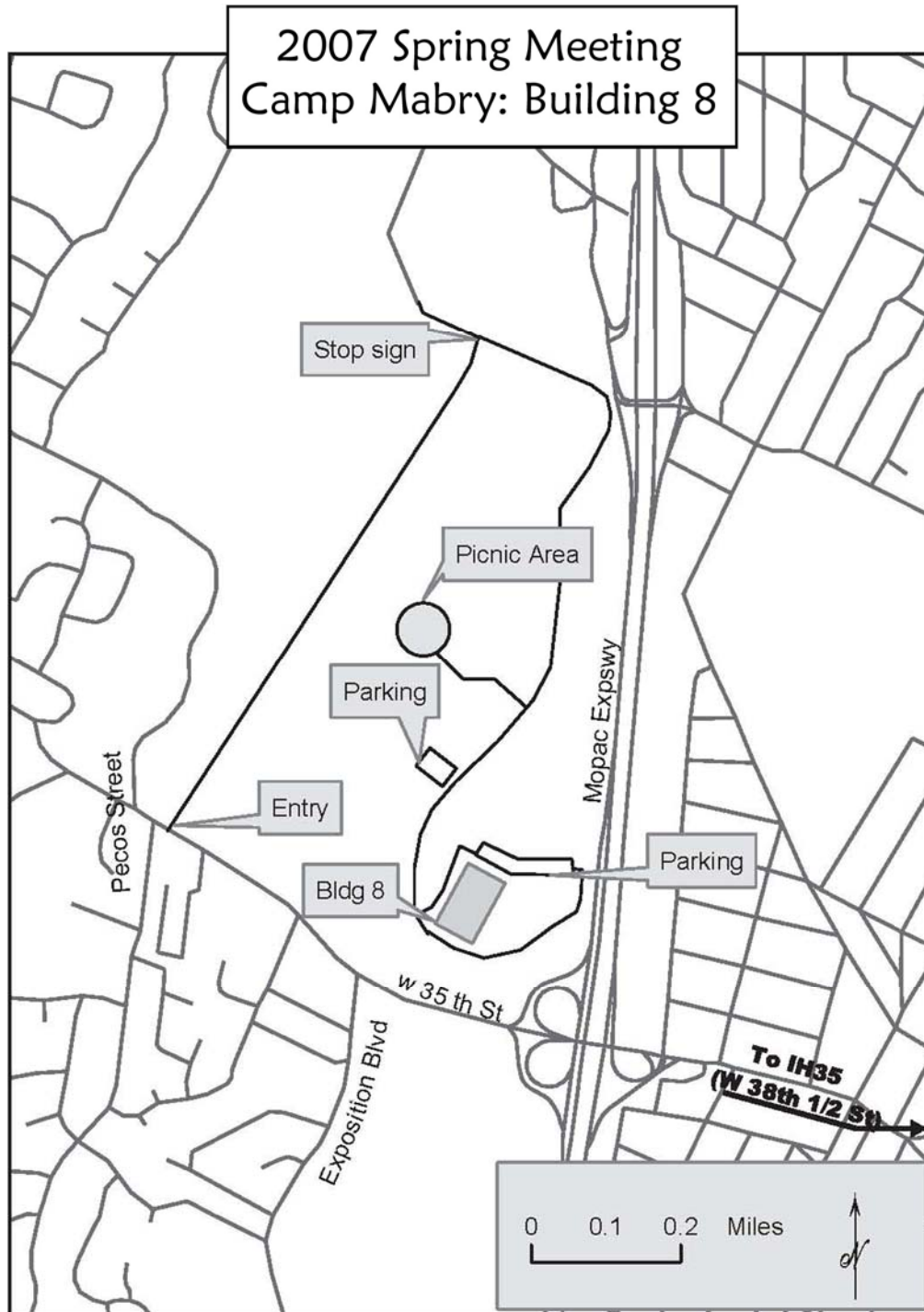
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PRESIDENTS' FORUM

CALL FOR PAPERS

The Council of Texas Archeologists seeks paper presentations for its Annual Spring meeting, to be held at Camp Mabry in Austin, Texas on March 7th. Two types of presentations are sought: Symposium papers and updates on recent projects. Preference will be given to papers on the symposium theme. These presentations will be made on Friday afternoon, following the business meeting.

SYMPOSIUM

Burned Rock Midden Research: The last 20 years

Twenty years ago the Council of Texas Archeologists sponsored a symposium on burned rock middens. That symposium served as a venue to examine work to date on these common monuments to prehistoric central Texas life ways, and resulted in a publication. Since then, a lot has happened and this seems like a good time to reflect upon work that has been performed in the last two decades that has provided new perspectives on the nature, origin, function, age, and significance of burned rock middens. We seek papers highlighting studies that have provided new information and/or studies that have changed our impressions of burned rock middens and their meaning through the application of novel field methods, analytical methods, or simply solid basic research. Symposium presentations are expected to be around 20 to 30 minutes in length, but variable length presentations may be accommodated.

For this venue we seek papers on projects that have been recently completed or that are still ongoing which may be of interest to the CTA membership. Presentation for this venue of 20 minutes.

In this issue of the CTA newsletter, you will find a proposed 2008 budget, minutes from the Fall 2007 meeting in San Antonio, and a membership renewal/change of address form. Please review and be ready to discuss and vote on the proposed 2008 budget at the Spring meeting at Camp Mabry.

Our accounts are doing well. As of February 1, 2008, the Money Market account is at \$8,835.45; our Scholarship Fund contains \$7,729.14; and our Checking account is currently at \$12,583.08.

Recently, it has come to our attention that CTA's Employer Identification Number (EIN) was deactivated. We must have an EIN in order to have IRS non-profit status as a Section 501(c)(6). When I spoke with the IRS, they could not find our EIN number in their system and suggested that it was likely dropped a long time ago. Non-profits only file taxes if they take in more than \$25,000 in a single tax year. As the CTA does not have that kind of income, we have not filed anything since receiving our tax-exempt status in 1988. Apparently, after so many years of "inactivity", they automatically drop our EIN. This could have happened at any time in the last 15 years through no fault of anyone in the organization. The Secretary/Treasurers of the CTA have all abided by the requirements outlined in the letter that was sent to us by the IRS in 1988. Even today, the IRS website says nothing about us needing to contact them every few years if we don't file taxes each year. We will file annual reports from now on, no matter how much income we collect. I will proceed in the direction that the IRS has sent me. At this time, we know of one major way in which this IRS situation will negatively affect us and the accounts. PayPal will place "limits" on our account with them. While PayPal has not fully explained what limits will be placed on the account (despite multiple communications to and from PayPal), one can only assume that they will hold back some of our money until the situation is resolved. I will be happy to

answer any questions regarding the issue during the Spring CTA meeting.

There have been some questions from the membership about joining the CTA_org Yahoo! Group, and I would like to clarify some of the issues here. There are three ways to join the group, and up to this point I have encouraged everyone to use two of the three ways. The first method is to search for CTA_org in Yahoo! Groups, and request to join. I receive a message asking for approval, which I grant if I know the requester or if there is a mention of being a CTA member in the message. The requestor then receives notice that they have been approved. The second method is to e-mail me at mbonine@swca.com and ask to join. I then send an invitation to join the group, which side-steps the approval process and the recipient can join automatically. BOTH of these methods require a Yahoo! ID. This enables group members to access the webpage for CTA_org, look at the calendar, change their settings, review old messages, etc., as well as send and receive messages.

The third way to join, which is not recommended as strongly, is for those that absolutely DO NOT want to create a Yahoo! ID. This method involves me adding the person to the group manually. In this case the member will receive an e-mail welcoming the member to the group, and provides e-mail addresses to post messages and to unsubscribe. If I add a person using this method, the member can only post messages via the e-mail address and receive copies of messages sent to the group. This member will not be able to change their settings (such as requesting a daily digest of messages), nor will they be able to access the webpage for the group. This method of joining can only be used to send and receive messages, nothing else.

I hope this clarifies the methods of joining the CTA_org Yahoo! Group. I would like to encourage *everyone* to join the group, regardless of the method you choose. Remember, the group will now be available for job postings and will likely be expanded to include more features in the years to come. Announcements

The first announcement was a reminder to attend the CTA/TAS "Careers in Archaeology" Social at 9 PM that evening.

Approval of Minutes from the Spring 2007 Meeting (as published in CTA newsletter)

The first order of business was the approval of the Spring 2007 meeting minutes. The minutes were amended during the meeting to clarify Rachel Feit's suggestion made during the discussion of Archaeological Survey Standards. Rachel's suggestion was a comment on Historic Sites specifically. She stated that she thought it was important to explore the option of changing the survey standards to clarify historic survey standards and the level of research required for historic sites. After this clarification, the approval of the meeting minutes was entertained for a motion, the motion was seconded, and passed.

Officers' Reports*President*

Charles Frederick, President, briefly reported on his interactions with Lewis "Indiana" Smith and the Surface Hunters of Texas. This group wants the THC to amend the historic properties regulations to allow surface collecting from state lands. Charles stated that he would post the entire series of letters on the website. Charles then discussed the winners of the Texas Archaeology Month Grant. The year's recipients were Concho Valley Archeological Society and Rio Grande Delta Archeology Society. Congratulations to both groups! The Concho Valley Archeological Society held an archeology fair entitled, "Yesteryears Revisited," and was kind enough to provide us with a few photos (see this newsletter; below). Charles suggested that we consider increasing the available fund for these Grants, but an amount has yet to be decided.

President Elect

Nick Trierweiler, President Elect, had no report at this time.

Secretary/Treasurer

Marie Archambeault, Secretary/Treasurer, reported an accounting of the membership and contractors' list numbers for the year as well as the bank account totals. Our membership includes 164 professionals, 11 students, and 52 contractors. The checking account contains \$12,793.08; the Money Market contains \$8,827.77; and \$7,723.30 is in the Scholarship Endowment Fund account. She announced that we should have our Money Market and our Scholarship Fund moved into CDs by the Spring meeting. Marie also commented on the memberships need to keep their contact information up to date and to join the Yahoo! Groups CTA_org listserv.

Newsletter Editor

Mindy Bonine, Newsletter Editor, reiterated the need for the entire membership to join the Yahoo! Groups CTA_org listserv. Announcements such as the date and time of next meeting, newsletters, and membership reminders will only be sent out to individuals who have joined the listserv.

CTA Communications

Charles asked if there were other volunteers for the committee and Carolyn Spock and Jean Hughes volunteered.

Contractors List

Erin Watkins, Committee Chair, was not in attendance, but sent the message that everything is going well with the list. She also mentioned that the Contractors' List will only be updated once a month now, so be sure to pay your fees on time. For email reminders, be sure to join the CTA listserv!

Curation

Pat Clabaugh, Committee Chair, will be posting a draft of the curation standards before the Spring 2008 meeting. Basically, this includes scratching the last part. Digital preservation is the primary issue holding up the standards. Pat requested that input from anyone in the membership on how they handle their digital archives. If you have any information that

would be helpful, please contact a member of the curation committee.

Governmental Affairs

Rachel Feit, Committee Chair, discussed Louis Smith's proposed surface bill in more detail. She also briefly discussed the transfer of historic properties to the THC from Texas Parks and Wildlife. The new NAGPRA regulations concerning unidentifiable human remains were also briefly mentioned at this time.

Multicultural Relations

Mary Jo Galindo, Committee Chair, was not present and had no report.

Nominating

Russell Brownlow, Committee Chair, was not present and had no report.

Public Education

David Brown, Committee Chair, announced they were looking for 2008 E. Mott Davis Award nominations.

Special Committee Reports

Academic Archeology and CRM

The academic archaeology and CRM committee had no report.

Anti-Looting

The anti-looting committee had no report.

Archeological Survey Standards

Rachel Feit again clarified her position concerning historic sites and consistency in requirements by both THC and TxDOT. She suggested that we might want to think about a different set of standards for historic sites, with a breakdown of requirements for survey, testing, and data recovery that would describe the level of archival work necessary at each stage. At this point it was suggested that we create a new ad-hoc committee to take care of Performance Standards. Rachel Feit volunteered to be the committee chair.

History

Doug Boyd, Committee Chair, requested that past officers submit their files to him to be curated at CAR.

Membership

Allen Bettis and Steve Ahr, Committee Chairs, had no report.

Agency Reports

THC

Pat Mercado-Allinger reported on the curatorial certification status. She announced that the Texas Preservation Trust Grant awarded almost \$70,000. She reminded the membership that they are still accepting applications for curatorial certification and preservation grants. Pat discussed the transfer of 18 historic sites to the THC. The transfer will create a new division that will oversee these sites. The collections will be transferred to the THC as well. Pat also announced that they are accepting applications to fill the various vacancies. Pat called to our attention that Proposition 4, which is connected to funding for the transferred sites, was on the November ballot.

Pat updated the membership on the legal issues associated with the Wilson-Leonard Site. The Wilson-Leonard site was donated to the THC in 1992 with a reverter clause. A land developer needed road access to the area behind the site. The Archaeology Conservancy would pay for the testing of a 0.25 acre area with shallow upland/bedrock soils, in exchange for the preservation of 0.33 acres of alluvial soils. When the individual who donated the site to THC passed away, the title company had read the language in the deed to the descendents, who then argued that they had a clause to take back the land. The Archeology Conservancy filed a lawsuit in return stating that they did not break the reverter clause. The Judge ultimately decided that the reverter clause had NOT been met. The Archeology Conservancy is appealing the case.

Pat announced that the Travis County Commissioners had passed the law allowing metal detecting in city parks, but the law is under appeal to the Attorney General. The language is specific, but the enforcement is minimal.

TPWD

Margaret Howard stated that 93 state parks are still under the control of Texas Parks and Wildlife, and they finally received additional funding. She also announced they had some job vacancies to fill.

TxDOT

Scott Pletka announced that there is a change in the administration at TxDOT and that they are reprioritizing to focus primarily on safety projects such as bridges and road widening. TxDOT staff will be taking on more of their own projects. Scott mentioned that they are still not satisfied with the research designs that they have received. At this

point, TxDOT will be taking more of an active role in the development of research designs. He also mentioned that TxDOT will be developing protocols for specific analyses to help broad application of cross site research. This will include minimal set of observation data. Once a draft is developed, it will be circulated for outside input. Scott also announced that the some of the General Services contracts will be up for renewal in late 2008. Lain Ellis added to Scott's discussion by stating that TxDOT's budgets have been slashed from \$6 billion to \$3.3 billion.

Old Business

Publications Page on CTA Website

Mindy announced the policies for publications on the website. It will be available for posting papers, drafts, working papers, reports, etc. CTA presentations will also be posted on the website. These documents will not be reviewed, but will be sorted at a later date depending on the number of documents are received. CTA Membership is a requirement to post a document. Proposal should be submitted to Mindy (mbonine@swca.com) as a tagged PDF.

Charles made a motion to vote on the changes to the CTA Bylaws. The motion was moved, seconded, and passed.

Mindy mentioned that the officers had been approached by individuals requesting to post a job advertisement. It was decided that the postings should go on our CTA_org listserv rather than on the general website.

EXISTING BYLAWS OF THE COUNCIL OF TEXAS ARCHEOLOGISTS

ARTICLE VI. Meetings

Section I. Regular Meetings

There shall be two regular meetings held each year: (1) Fall Meeting, held in conjunction with the Annual Meeting of the Texas Archeological Society unless decided otherwise at the Spring Meeting, and (2) Spring Meeting, in Austin, Texas, the date of which shall be selected at the preceding regular Fall Meeting. Notification of members to the last known address shall be made at least 15 days prior to any meetings.

PROPOSED CHANGES

ARTICLE VI. Meetings

Section I. Regular Meetings

There shall be two regular meetings held each year: (1) Fall Meeting, held in conjunction with the Annual Meeting of the Texas Archeological Society unless

decided otherwise at the Spring Meeting, and (2) Spring Meeting, in Austin, Texas, unless another location is agreed upon by a majority vote of the membership at the previous Fall Meeting, the date of which shall be selected at the preceding regular Fall Meeting. 2008 East Texas Archeological Conference

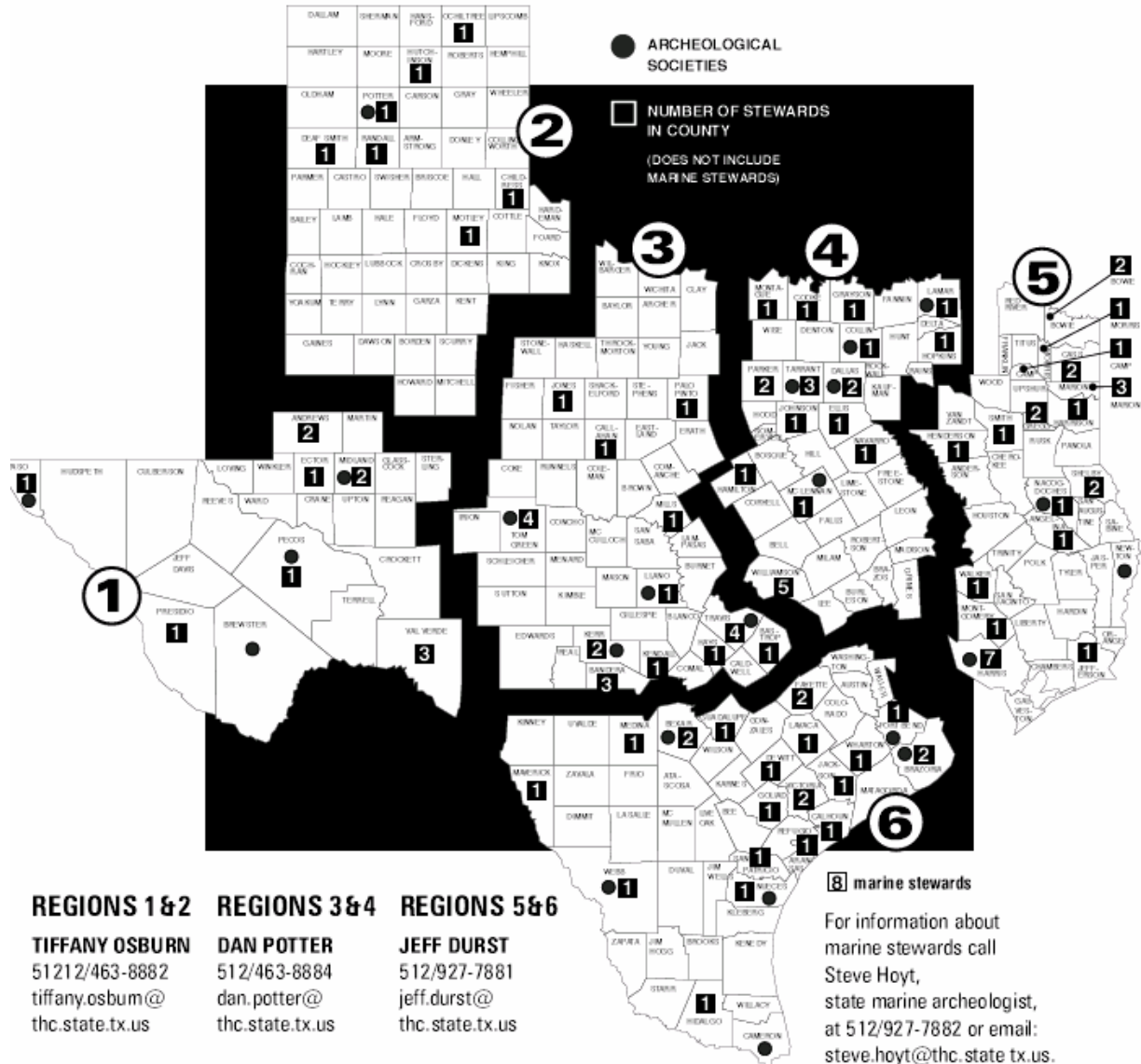

Conservation of Metal Artifacts

There has been a discussion lately about the problem of metal objects not being properly conserved prior to their placement in a curatorial facility, and the President has been asked to place the issue on the Spring meeting agenda. Most ferrous objects that have been collected are discarded prior to curation of collections; in most cases, the THC has no problem approving such discards. However, there are also many projects that produce significant metal artifacts that are worthy of curation and it's hard to think of many cases where those objects are receiving proper conservation treatment prior to curation. This problem is not just a concern to PIs and CRM firms, it's also that in some cases the curatorial facilities are not requiring the objects to be conserved prior to accepting them. Because of this, it would be advantageous for primary curatorial facility personnel to attend the Spring meeting so that they may join in on this conversation.
